

#### 'CHILL' WINTER ENERGY BILLS

The weather this time of year is typically too cold for outdoor energy-saving chores, but there are still steps you can take inside your home to lower energy costs:

- **Take advantage of daylight.** Open curtains and blinds on sun-facing windows during the day to allow sunlight in and help warm the home.
- Check for drafty outlets and switch plates. If you feel cold air, install insulating pads under outlet and switch plate covers. Plug inserts into unused outlets.
- Turn down your water heater. Lower the thermostat from 140 to 120 degrees on an electric water heater, and set it between warm and hot on a gas heater.
- Close fireplace flue dampers. When not using the fireplace, a closed flue damper and glass doors can stop heated air from rushing up the chimney and outside.
- **Keep garage doors closed** as often as possible to keep cold air from making its way inside.

**Replace air-system filters frequently**, according to manufacturer's instructions. A dirty filter restricts airflow and makes your system work harder.

Remember these tips and put a chill to those high winter energy bills.

### **POWER COST ADJUSTMENT FOR 2023**

The 2023 power cost adjustment (PCA) is \$8.55 per month for a customer using 1,000 kilowatt-hours per month, a \$00.95 95-cent reduction from the 2022 PCA rate. The total 2023 savings to customers is estimated to be \$4.1 million.

As a not-for-profit cooperative, state law prevents NOVEC from earning a margin (profit) on electricity it purchases for delivery to customers. Instead, the actual purchased power cost is passed through to customers without any mark-up. NOVEC reconciles the difference between its forecast for customer energy use and its actual purchased power expense using the PCA line item on customers' monthly bills.
